I have had children and now grandchildren in this school over the past 35 years and she has been the best nurse to ever happen to Bridesburg Elementary. She has a kind and caring heart as well as an ability to make any illness or injury feel better in a visit. My granddaughter recently lost her dog, in January. When she came home she told me how Mrs. Valentino helped make her feel better with a simple hug and listening to her cry.
