Description:

Why is this contract needed?

The roof has been evaluated and is in need of replacement. The building's windows which were installed in 1970 will be replaced by new low-e hopper-style windows. This project will complete scope gaps from previous efforts to renovate the entire facility by addressing the exterior envelope, interior finishes, electrical service, elevator and providing new toilet rooms.

How is this work connected to the District’s plan to achieve Goals and Guardrails?

Our mission is to provide a safe learning environment for children. We do this by identifying and supporting investments in the buildings that the students in Philadelphia learn in.
