The Administration recommends that the Board of Education authorize The School District of Philadelphia, through the Superintendent or his designee, to execute and perform a contract, subject to funding, as follows:

Description:

The Department of Transportation Services (Transportation) requests authorization to enter into a contract with Genuine Parts Company (GPC) to supply critical parts and materials necessary for the maintenance and repair of the District's yellow bus and non-bus fleet. GPC offers an extensive inventory of automotive components, including tires, oil filters, brakes, engine oil, and windshield wipers, essential to sustaining daily garage operations. The primary parts store is located at the Broad Street Garage and serves as a distribution hub, providing parts to all District-operated garages and contracted vendors. GPC will be using dedicated space in the Broad Street Garage and will enter into a licensing arrangement with the District for use of the space.

Why is this contract needed?

This contract is necessary to ensure uninterrupted access to high-quality parts and supplies required to maintain the safety, reliability, and performance of the District's transportation fleet. With 286 buses and over 424 non-bus vehicles in operation, the ability to efficiently source replacement parts is vital for reducing repair delays, minimizing vehicle downtime, and maintaining compliance with safety standards. GPC's extensive inventory and consistent delivery services support the District's ability to meet operational demands and keep students safely and reliably transported.

How will the success of this contract be measured?

Success will be measured by the availability and timely delivery of parts, reduced vehicle repair turnaround time, and sustained or improved fleet readiness. Key performance indicators will include fulfillment rates for parts orders, garage feedback on product quality and vendor service, and reductions in vehicle downtime due to parts shortages. The contract's effectiveness will also be evaluated by monitoring maintenance costs and the overall impact on fleet operational efficiency.
